

HVRTA History 1986-1997

- 1986: HVRTA is founded.
- 1989: Dutchess County Legislature purchases 20.38 miles of trail right-of-way, including 4.34 miles in Columbia County, on behalf of NYS Parks.
- 1992: HVRTA volunteers begin clearing sections of trail in Columbia and Dutchess Counties.
- 1996: The first section of trail opens 4.5 miles from Amenia to Coleman Station. HVRTA is incorporated.
- 1997: 4.0 miles of trail opens from Undermountain Road in Ancram to Taconic State Park in Copake Falls.





HVRTA History 2000-2017

- 2000: 3.6 miles of trail opens from Millerton to Coleman Station. Bridge opens over the Bash Bish Brook in Copake Falls.
- 2005: 2.6 miles of trail opens extending the trail from Amenia to Wassaic - the trail and train from NYC are now linked!
- 2010: HVRTA and Columbia Land Conservancy receive an State grant for design and construction documents for the Copake Falls to Hillsdale section of trail.
- 2013: HVRTA receives State grant for construction of 1.54 miles of trail from Black Grocery Rd to Anthony St, Hillsdale.
- 2015-2017: Copake Falls to Orphan Farm meadow and Black Grocery to Anthony St. Hillsdale opens.





HVRTA Overview 2019-present

- 2019: HVRTA in partnership with NYS Parks receives a \$1.9 M federal TAP (Transportation Alternatives Program)grant to construct a bridge over State Route 22 in Copake connecting the east and west sides of the trail. Construction expected 2024.
- 2020: Millerton north to Undermountain Rd Ancram, 8 miles opens.

 2023: HVRTA received a \$325,000 grant for the final design and construction documents on the 8 mile section from the Village of Chatham to the Village of Philmont.








HVRTA's Future Plans

- Phase I-Build the trail from the Village of Chatham to the Bartlett House
- Phase II- Build from Bartlett House crossing to the Village of Philmont
- Build out the Hillsdale section to the Taconic State Parkway
- The Golden Spike! Connect both sides of the trail with crossing of the Taconic State Parkway!










THE VISION

- To integrate the Philmont to Chatham section of the trail with the developed and developing sections of the trail.




PHILMONT / CARPENTER RD TO KONIG RD 4.7 Miles

Overall Site -Trail Length 8.2Miles



Ghent Routing Plan




Ghent Routing Plan Enlargement






Camphill Road Routing Plan Enlargement






Price Chopper Plan October 2023



Driveway Crossing (Typical) -Proposed




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
Chatham Routing Plan Enlargement






